

**RULES CONCERNING PRIVATE PARTIES HELD AT**  
**THE UN BEACH CLUB**

The UN Beach Club is open to all international civil servants, their invitees and family members, members of Permanent Missions to the United Nations Office at Geneva, and to delegates attending international conferences.

**The reservation of the restaurant for a private party can only be made by a member of the UN Beach Club.** The Club is open to all members and cannot be exclusively reserved for a group, even if it is a large number. Additionally, **during a private event, members can, if they wish, have normal access to the Club for all the regular facilities.**

An entrance fee of CHF 3.- per person (CHF 5.- for weddings), is charged by the restaurant, and constitutes a contribution to the cost of security. The presence of a guard at the Club is obligatory and is imposed by the Administration of UNOG for all evening events. When the number of invitees is above 100 persons, the engagement of several security guards for the evening is necessary. In such a case, the cost of extra security guards is the responsibility of the person organizing the evening event.

The volume of music must be of a reasonable level. The authorization for such evening events is given on condition that the music does not cause inconvenience for the neighbourhood, and that it does not go on after midnight except special authorization by the UNOG Administration.

**The event is placed under the responsibility of the UN Beach Club member who has made the invitations.** The member is responsible for all damage or eventual deprecation, which could happen on the site of the UN Beach Club.

An alphabetic list of all the invitees has to be provided to the UN Beach Club as soon as possible for the control of entries by the security guards.

The Committee of the UN Beach Club has the right at any time to modify, according to the circumstances, and in the interests of the Club, the above-mentioned rules.
